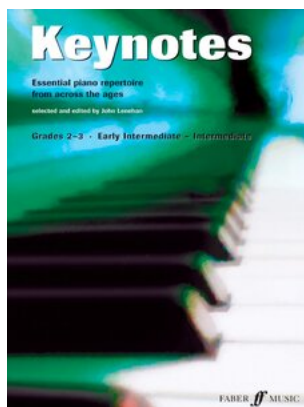

This is a minuet on a grand scale – imagine a full orchestral sound at the opening. Reserve your quietest singing sound for the trio (perhaps a solo flute?) and exaggerate the fortissimo when the full orchestra join in again. The effect should be funny – Schubert wrote lots of this kind of music as pure entertainment.
