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Sonata in A major K.208

'This beautiful sonata is a joy to play. Song-like in character, it requires expressive phrasing and shaping. Although in the major key, the syncopations and sighing appoggiaturas create a mood of melancholy. The texture is sparse, with a simple accompaniment supporting the flowing melody. It requires little or no pedal so that the articulation can speak clearly. A little more weight is needed for the syncopated notes, and in the second half many semiquavers need to be slurred (e.g. 2nd and 4th beats in bars 18 and 19). Trills begin on the upper note, and the two cadential trills closing each section can be played as demisemiquavers with turned endings, as shown at the end of the second section.' Andante e cantabile
